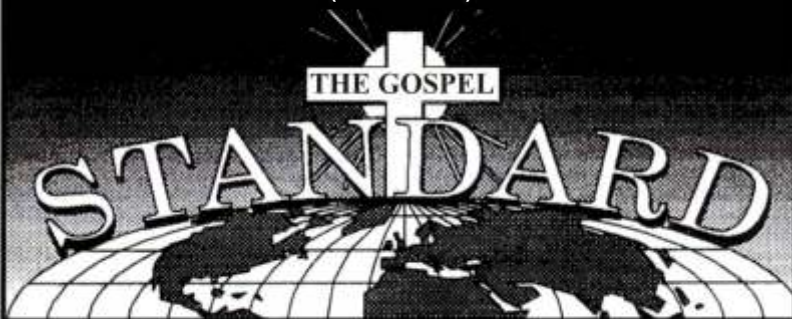

# THE GOSPEL STANDARD

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## The Christian's NEW THINGS

Most of us find a thrill in the possession of new things. The new house that is the fulfillment of our dreams; the new book we are so eager to read; these and many other new things add brightness to our lives. But these new things, important as they may seem at the time, have only temporary value and pass away with the using. There is one class of people, however, who may claim new possessions that never grow old. The true Christian possesses lasting new things, and more of them than we have ever realized. Let us consider some of these.

From the moment when we received Christ as Saviour, each one of us became a new creature. "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new" (2 Corinthians 5:17). New hopes, new desires, new ambitions, a new outlook on life—all these "new things" come into being with the transformation which divine grace has wrought in us.

Finish, then, Thy new creation;  
Pure and spotless let us be:  
Let us see Thy great salvation  
Perfectly restored in Thee;  
Changed from glory into glory,  
Till in Heaven we take our place,  
Till we cast our crowns before Thee,  
Lost in wonder, love, and praise.

The Christian finds a new way of approach to God. "Having therefore, brethren, boldness to enter into the holiest by the blood of

Jesus, by a **new and living way**, which He hath consecrated for us,...let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith” (Hebrews 10:19-22). What a precious new possession is this, the privilege of going to God as a loving Father, of entering into His presence unafraid, of telling Him all that is in our hearts, knowing that He will hear us!

What a friend we have in Jesus,  
All our sins and griefs to bear!  
What a privilege to carry  
Everything to God in prayer!

These blessings fill the heart of the Christian with gratitude and joy, and what is a more natural expression of these feelings than song? So we find that another “new thing” we possess is a new song. “And He hath put a **new song** in my mouth, even praise unto our God: many shall see it, and fear, and shall trust in the Lord” (Psalm 40:3). This song is entirely different from the world’s songs. They are full of restless longing; our “new song” is a song of trust and peace.

The Christian is not left to grope his way through life in the dark, but has been provided with a Guidebook called the Bible. In this Book are many rules for our conduct, among them one rule in particular to which our Lord referred as a new commandment. “A **new commandment** I give unto you, That ye love one another” (John 13:34). Thus there exists among true believers a tie of fellowship that not only binds them together, but also binds them, in turn, to their Father in Heaven.

Blest be the tie that binds  
Our hearts in Christian love:  
The fellowship of kindred minds  
Is like to that above.

When a Christian has failed to do his duty, or has wandered from the path marked out for him by his Guidebook, we may well praise God that there is another new thing God has prepared for him, and that is cleansing and restoration. Someone has written lines beginning:

I wish that there were some wonderful place  
Called the Land of Beginning Again.

Let that discouraged writer join the happy company of Christians, and he will find that his wish has come true. He will have discovered the

secret of “beginning again,” and will be able to say:

Perverse and foolish oft I strayed,  
But yet in love He sought me,  
On His shoulder gently laid,  
And home, rejoicing, brought me.

For “if we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness” (1 John 1:9). Again, the Christian is the constant recipient of **new mercies**. All through his earthly pilgrimage the Christian is conscious of the loving care and tender mercy of the Good Shepherd. Amid dangers seen and unseen He leads His own safely, if they but trust Him. “It is of the Lord’s mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness” (Lamentations 3:22-23).

The “new things” or possessions of the Christian, already named, are bestowed here and now, but these are not all that we are to receive. There are still others to be bestowed in that happy future life which is to be ours. We are to receive a new name. “To him that overcometh will I give...a white stone, and in the stone **a new name** written, which no man knoweth saving he that receiveth it” (Revelation 2:17). And added to the song God gave us to sing upon earth He will give another **new song**, more wonderful even than the first. What joy awaits us when we sing with the heavenly choir this “new song” of praise unto him who hath redeemed us by His precious blood (Revelation 5:9)!

Finally, there will be prepared for us a new heaven and a new earth. “Nevertheless we, according to His promise, look for **new heavens and a new earth**, wherein dwelleth righteousness” (2 Peter 3:13). And in that new and purified earth our Lord has prepared for us a new city. “And I John saw the holy city, **new Jerusalem**, coming down from God out of heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband (Revelation 21:2). Oh, these wonderful “new things” of the future life! “Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love Him. But God hath revealed them unto us by His Spirit” (1 Corinthians 2:9,10).

If all these “new things” are yours, both in present possession and in anticipation, then “rejoice, and be exceeding glad.” You have riches that cannot be measured, for “all things are yours; and ye are Christ’s; and Christ is God’s” (1 Corinthians 3:22,23).

# The Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends:

**“Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new”** (2 Corinthians 5:17).

Will it be just another year, or a New Year? If it cannot be a new year in Christian experience, how can it be a “Happy New Year?”

For some people, it will be just another year of uncertainty and fear, another year of deepening departure from God, another year of world tensions and war clouds. Bunyan was right when he likened the world to a jungle full of beasts prowling about, snapping and snarling and showing their teeth at one another, albeit holding peace conferences. Let men talk about the dawning of a new day, but the fact remains that the Devil still **“deceiveth the whole world...”** (Revelation 12:9).

The answer to world problems is the new birth. For this old world, the phrase “A Happy New Year” is meaningless without the new birth. There is neither a new world or a new year without being born again. As life must begin at birth, so new life for the sinner must begin by rebirth. Man may make new resolutions, but what the world needs is new men with new hearts and new spirits to walk in newness of life.

There are those who fail to walk in newness of life because they have failed to put off the old life. God tells us to *“put off”* the old and then *“put on”* the new (Colossians 3:9,10). **“Be not conformed to this world”** (Romans 12:2a). We are to be separated in heart and spirit from this present evil world. Let us remember that because **“Ye are not of the world...therefore the world hateth you”** (John 15:19). When the world “cannot hate you,” because it has no cause of quarrel with you, then be sure you have somewhere compromised with the world. Spiritual “nonconformity” is one of the great needs of the hour.

Oh, to be like our blessed Lord, and to know more about Him, should be our desire as we enter a new year. Feed more on God's Word. Wait

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upon God. Keep close accounts with God. Start each day knowing you are in fellowship with your Lord. Let us pray for revival. Let's pray, "Lord, send revival and start with me." Then we know we shall have a "Happy New Year" as we enter 2007.

As we start the new year together, I want to take a moment and praise the Lord for His faithfulness in 2006. It has been a year of reaching out for souls in the radio ministry. 
There seems to be more interest today in programs, buildings, gymnasiums, and modern equipment, than in sending the Gospel to a dying world. One wonders how many Christians today really believe

When I say unto the wicked, Thou shalt surely die; and thou givest him not warning, nor speakest to warn the wicked from his wicked way, to save his life; the same wicked man shall die in his iniquity; but his blood will I require at thine hand. Yet if thou warn the wicked, and he turn not from his wickedness, nor from his wicked way, he shall die in his iniquity; but thou hast delivered thy soul.”**

In March, if our Lord tarry, I shall be 90 years of age. As I write this letter, I am still preaching twice on Sundays and working full-time in the radio ministry. Your fellowship in the Gospel is such an encouragement to myself and our missionary staff. We are burdened for a world without Christ. Perhaps you can help us even more this month and this year. When the whirlwind shall be loosed, woe to the tree that hath not sucked up fresh sap and grasped the rock with many intertwined roots. When tempests arise, woe to the mariners that have not strengthened their mast nor cast their anchor nor sought the haven.

If we suffer the good to grow weaker, then the evil will surely gather for the mastery over us; and so a painful desolation and a lamentable disgrace may follow.

Let us draw near to the footstool of divine mercy in humble entreaty, and we shall realize the fulfillment of the promise, “They that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength.”

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## THE '59 REVIVAL IN SCOTLAND

Robert Cunningham – “The Briggate Butcher” – was one of the notable converts of the Revival. Crowds gathered to listen to his testimony. The fact that he had lost an eye in a Briggate fight made them draw near. He had a voice that sounded like thunder, and when he was inviting sinners to Jesus, he often cried out, “*Ah, ma freens, what ails ye at Him?*”

This revival began in prayer. Here and there, in town and country, groups of people gathered around the Throne of Grace. This was not due to the call of the Church. It was not planned by human wisdom. It was the secret inspiration of God, who was pouring out the spirit of grace and supplications. The movement expanded. Prayer unions were formed. The noonday prayer meeting followed and many, leaving their business at the busiest time of the day, hastened to spend an hour at the mercy seat.

### **ANSWERS TO PRAYER — MIRACLES OF GRACE**

A new thing took place, requests for prayer were presented, thousands of petitions, bearing on every phase of human misery and need, were laid before God. Notable answers came to light. A woman requests prayer for a scoffing husband, and on returning to her house, she finds the scoffer on his knees. A wandering youth, lost to sight, is prayed for, and shortly afterwards, the prodigal is converted in a foreign hospital, and reappears at home a new man. A widow asks for prayer on behalf of her son at sea, and one night the sailor lad, as he paces the deck, is seized with the pangs of conviction, and then and there he gives himself to Christ. Prayer is offered for a notorious drunkard, and to the amazement of the community, he is suddenly arrested in his evil course, and becomes a miracle of grace.

### **A MARVELOUS OUTBURST OF JOY AND SONG**

With the Revival of Prayer, there came a wonderful thirst for the Word of God, and the Gospel was preached with saving power in church and hall, on the field, at the seaside, in the noisy street, and amid the hubbub of the fair. The multitude of the awakened rendered the inquiry meeting a necessity. The inquirers came from every quarter, from east-end and west-end, from drawing-room and scullery, from the plough and the public-house, from foundry and factory, from shop and slum, from the college and the gutter. They were for the most part characterized by a pungent sense of sin, and a solemn dread of the wrath of God, and when through grace they passed from death unto life, there was a marvelous outburst of joy and song. The time of the singing of birds was come, and everywhere the air seemed to resound with the voices of prayer and praise.

Whole communities were moved, and the only topic of the day

was the Revival and the more recent conversions. Many thousands were added to the company of the saved throughout the land. Many of the converts became office-bearers in churches, Sunday School teachers, mission workers, while not a few studied for the ministry, and became pastors at home or missionaries abroad. The effect on home mission work was such that whole congregations were gathered out of the slums, and many of the most degraded classes became burning and shining lights of grace.

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## **Some Signs That Your Church Is Following Rick Warren**

1. Change in music to a contemporary rock style.
2. Removal of hymn books; eliminating the choir.
3. Replacement of organ and piano with heavy metal instruments.
4. Repetitive singing of praise lyrics.
5. Dressing down to casual and informal attire.
6. Eliminating of business meetings, church committees, council of elders, board of deacons, etc.
7. The pastor, or a new leader with a few assistants, usually four, takes charge of all church business.
8. A repetitive 40-day Purpose Driven Church study program stressing psychological relationships with each other, the community, or the world, begins.
9. Funded budgeted programs are abandoned, or ignored, with ambiguous financial reports made.
10. Sunday morning, evening, and/or Wednesday prayer meetings are changed to other times; some may even be eliminated.
11. Sunday School teachers are moved to different classes, or replaced by new teachers more sympathetic with the changes being implemented.
12. The name "Sunday School" is dropped and classes are given new names.
13. Crosses and other traditional Christian symbols may be moved from both the inside and outside of the church building. The pulpit may also be removed.
14. In accordance with Dr. Warren's instructions, new version Bibles are used; or only verses flashed on a screen are referenced during regular services.
15. Purpose Driven Church films, purchased from Saddleback, precede or are used during regular services.
16. The décor, including the carpets, may be changed to eliminate any resemblance to the former church.

“***Failure at a crucial moment may mar the entire outcome of a life.*** A man who has enjoyed special light is made bold to follow in the way of the Lord, and is anointed to guide others therein. He rises to a place of love and esteem among the godly, and this promotes his advancement among men. What then? The

temptation comes to be careful of the position he has gained, and to do nothing to endanger it. The man, so lately a faithful man of God, compromises with worldlings, and to quiet his own conscience invents a theory by which such compromises are justified, even commended. He receives the praises of the judicious; he has, in truth, gone over to the enemy. The whole force of his former life now tells upon the wrong side...To avoid such an end it becomes us to ever stand fast.”

“It now becomes a serious question how far those who abide by the faith once delivered to the saints should fraternize with those who have turned aside to another gospel. Christian love has its claims, and divisions are to be shunned as grievous sins; **but how far are we justified in being in confederacy with those who are departing from the truth?** It is a difficult question to answer so as to keep the balance of our duties. For the present it behooves believers to be cautious, lest they lend their support and countenance to the betrayers of the Lord...Numbers of easy-minded people wink at error so long as it is committed by a clever man and a good-natured brother, who has so many fine points about him. Let each believer judge for himself; but, for our part, we have put on a few fresh bolts to our door, and we have given orders to keep the chain up; for, under colour of begging the friendship of the servant, there are those about who aim at robbing THE MASTER. We fear it is hopeless ever to form a society which can keep out men base enough to profess one thing and believe another; but it might be possible to make an informal alliance among all who hold the Christianity of their fathers. **Little as they might be able to do, they could at least protest, and as far as possible free themselves of that complicity which will be involved in a conspiracy of silence.**”
